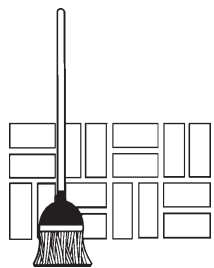

## Suggested Reading

How to Prevent Cardiovascular Disease and Major Cancers and How to Reverse Cardiovascular Disease

The #1 killer of US adults is cardiovascular disease. Its yardstick is cholesterol. No heart attacks or strokes have been reported in patients with total cholesterol levels below 120. Data shows 35% of asymptomatic patients with cholesterol of 200-150 experience acute heart attacks and strokes. The New England Journal of Med. reported that the Am. College of Cardiology in its 2007 meeting concluded: diet and drug therapy are the preferred treatment for cardiovascular disease for any patients with cholesterol of 150 and over, as it is safer and addresses its root cause which is due to improper diet. It recommended that open-heart bypasses, angioplasties, stents or endarterectomies, due to their mortality and morbidity should be performed only during emergencies. Such procedures only temporize the problem. Accumulation of arteriosclerotic cholesterol plaque that clogs our arteries cannot be prevented by these procedures thus recurrences are the norm. Studies show that in the majority of cases, plant-based diet is more successful in lowering cholesterol than drugs. For patients who have familial cholesterol problems, if diet alone does not bring down total cholesterol levels to 120 or below, additional drug therapy will be necessary. This step will successfully REVERSE and cure cardiovascular problems. WHY is this? Now DNA studies show humans are plant-eating species explaining why animal food and fats harm our organism. Breast, prostate and colon cancers among others are highly linked to animal based diets per reports from the Am Cancer Institute and World Cancer Research fund. National average price for open-heart surgery is \$38,000. The US spends 115 billion dollars a year in vascular care. While one strives to lower cholesterol to below 120, the American Heart Assn. recommends all adults to take a "baby" aspirin daily unless contraindicated, as adjunct preventive measure. This data is new and most physicians are not aware of this. Share with them and your loved ones this knowledge and read the references below:
