PIBYC Old Club Cruise-out

We will be guests of the Old Club on Harsens Island in the South Channel of the St. Clair River on Wednesday, July 14th-16th. Tuesday, the 13th is an optional day with the dining room and bar closed. Arrive early to take advantage of the facilities. Wednesday afternoon will be leisure and practice time for tennis, croquet, trap shooting, or golf. Longest hole is 120 yards, so bring 7-9 iron and putter. The pool and bar will also be open. Bring your dingy. Don't have a boat or boat too small but you would still like to dingy around? Trailer-it up and stay at the Old Club's "Ritz Hotel" with your cruising comrades. Cost is \$96.00/night (plus tax) Call 810-748-9931 for reservation. We'll gather to share stories of the day's exploits and enjoy hors d'oeuvres and dinner on Wednesday and Thursday evening as well as Friday for breakfast before departing. Check out is 3 p.m. on Friday. Dress is casual so long as men always wear a collard shirt and everyone leaves their blue jeans in their lockers. Be sure to check in at the office when you arrive and get your club ID number. All purchases will go on account (no cash) and your final bill will be mailed to your home. Cost per head will be approximately \$180.00 which includes all PIBYC planned meals and complete access to all the club's facilities. Other meals and all cocktails are at your own additional expense. Dockage is \$1.75/foot/night and trap shooting is \$15.00/round including shells and use of a shotgun. Feel free to serve cocktails on your boat but you need abstain from consuming private stock on the docks or anywhere on the premises. 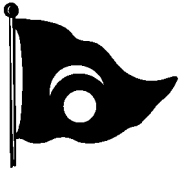
