Swim/Sail Numbers Up Again in 2011

As we wrap up registration for 2011, we have about one hundred and sixteen kids age 4 to 17 signed up to participate in swimming, sailing, or both. Like last year, we will be welcoming about twenty new sailors into our sail program. While the majority are from Ohio, we also have families traveling from New York, Connecticut, Illinois, Wisconsin and Maryland to take lessons while spending time with relatives on the island. Most can ride a bike to class, but seven juniors will be commuting daily from Middle Bass to sail.

Fortunately, we have an exciting mix of returning and new instructors in both the swim and sail programs. Last year's Endurance Swim instructor, Julianne Dinallo, will be joined this year by Kenzie Kasoff. Both girls are life guards on the island and will be teaching the morning and evening swim classes. Newcomers Morley Flynn and Ryan Lashaway will be joining last year's sailing instructors Marcy Butz and Kate O'Brien. All four are US Sailing Level I certified instructors with previous coaching/teaching experience. All either sail or have sailed at the college level and continue to race competitively. Additional assistance will be provided by our older junior sailors who have volunteered to help with classes. The extra hands will be helpful as we work to get everyone on the water and sailing as quickly as possible.

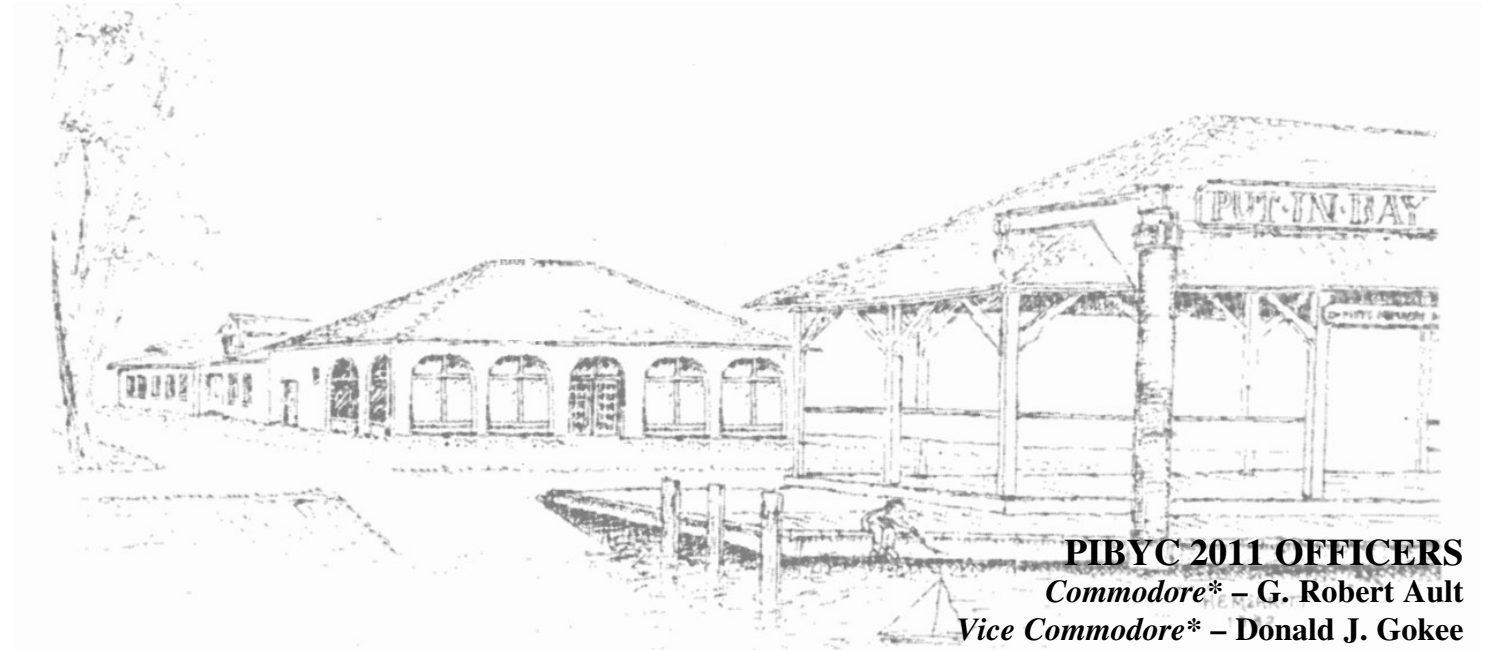
