

PUT-IN-BAY COMMUNITY SWIM/SAIL Registration Deadline May 1, 2010

Our goal is to provide water safety education to as many island children as possible. Please encourage friends and family with children age four and up to investigate our swimming lessons. Older children who have completed through Level IV of the American Red Cross Program swim Monday and Wednesday evenings beginning June 14th. Levels I through IV swim in the mornings for four weeks beginning June 21st.

Our Learn-to-Sail program teaches kids to sail with an emphasis on safety and fun. New this year, we will be holding a one-week Race Clinic beginning June 14th. This week is designed to jumpstart a summer of racing for those interested in off-island travel and participation in the I-LYA Junior Race Week. The clinic, however, will also accommodate those sailors who are new to racing but ready and willing to practice and learn. A four week Learn-to-Sail program will begin June 21st. Children from age 8 to 18 participate, sailing four days a week for two and a half to three hours a day.

Kroger Community Rewards Pays off for Swim/Sail!

It is no longer possible to sign up at the Customer Service desk.

IMPORTANT: The KCR program resets on April 1. If you were enrolled before that date you must "renew" or relink your Plus Card to Swim/Sail on or after April 1, 2010.

Swim/Sail has already received its first check from Kroger. So far only two people have signed up but those two earned \$30 for the program in only 3 months! Swim/Sail is a small program and every little bit counts. Help us shop our way to better funding for water safety education.


