The Old Club Cruise-Out is scheduled for July 7, 8, 9, 2004. For those who wish to arrive early on Tuesday, July 6, 2004, dockage is available and the pool is open. However their dining room and bar will be closed. The schedule will be the same as in the past years with trip guidebooks provided for members planning to attend. The cost is \$160.00 per person and includes dinner on Wednesday and Thursday, breakfast on Friday and hors d'oeuvres both nights. Dockage cost is \$1.65/ft. per night. If you would like to book a room at the Old Club "Ritz Hotel," they are available for \$96.00 a night, plus tax, for reservations call, (810) 748-9931. The deadline for sign-up and trip payment is June 26, 2004.
