The Freedom Party will be a cookout picnic-style hosted by the Bridge Officers and Friends. This past Fathers' Day *Simply Sharon* and Crew provided an outstanding brunch complete with omelets made-to-order, fresh fruit, bacon, sausage, great rolls. We will soon be implementing a new outside access Restroom and Shower Policy. We have surveyed the users of our restroom and shower facility and have found nearly a zero percentage usage by our PIBYC members. The vast majority of users of these facilities are non-members, some with affiliation with other lake yacht clubs. Many users come from the city docks, mooring balls, and private docks in Squaw Harbor. The maintenance of these facilities cost each PIBYC member a significant amount. Often our custodian, Chuck Roth, cleans each restroom multiple times per day plus the cost of water, sewage and propane to heat the water.

We will be offering yearly pass keys for our members with a modest refundable key deposit charge. Our dock rental tenants will receive a weekly passkey at the time of dock rental. Deposit will be required for passkey. Lake affiliated yacht club members, "AYC & I-LYA", can obtain a weekly passkey for a small fee per day and refundable key deposit. We believe that his policy will result in less expense to maintain our restroom and shower facilities, less operating costs and less chance for vandalism and abusive use.

We are very proud of our facilities, and we want to keep them in excellent conditions for many years to come.
