Our credit card machine is installed and working great. Please plan to bring your Visa or MasterCard to charge bar, meals and Ship's Store merchandise. Of course, we still accept old-fashion cash. We will be phasing out the in-house member charges due to the time and expense of billing these charges. Currently these charges are being billed by the volunteer labor of Valinda Vincent, treasurer.

Outside access restroom and shower facility policy seems to be working as expected. Access is key limited to PIBYC members, dock customers and members of affiliated yacht clubs with proof of membership.

PIBYC members may receive a yearly key for the entire season. The key deposit is \$50.00, refundable upon return of key at season's end. Our dock customers will receive a weekly key upon payment of a \$10.00 deposit. Affiliated yacht club members not docking at PIBYC may rent a weekly key at a cost of \$5.00 per day and a \$20.00 refundable deposit. Proof of affiliated yacht club membership is required. Keys are for the use of key assignee and guests on his/her boat and the use is not transferable. Abuse of this policy will result in confiscation of key and forfeiture of deposit. The outside access restrooms will be open and unlocked for special events and I-LYA Regattas.
