Advice from our Fleet Surgeon

Here are some ways to cut in pharmacy costs. Unless your doctor specifies, ask for generics since they are just as good. If tablets are sold in double the milligrams you need, ask your doctor to prescribe the higher dose. Cut these in half using a pill cutter. Buying via the internet saves time and money. WalMart is the least expensive of discount drugstores. Drugstore.com is the cheapest internet secure, accredited web store. It delivers to your home for free. Their 24-hour phone line has assistants that will walk you through step by step. If you do not want to give your credit card over the net, you can do it by phone.

This service does not work in emergencies because it takes a few days to complete the delivery. They also e-mail you a reminder when your prescriptions are due before you run out. Examples of prices for one-month supply.
