Mother Nature has been a little feisty lately so when you read this there may be snow, or high winds, or even a solar eclipse! Manager Dona Mitchell and the crew have shut down winter operations and will be taking the month of April to prepare for the 2024 season.

The front room refresh includes replacing the ceramic tile and carpet squares with an engineered sound reducing tile; adding wall treatments to the fireplace and bar walls to dampen sound; and installing acoustical drapery along the east windows. We will be working with contractors to install these improvements throughout the month of April. While professionals will handle some of the job, we also need volunteers to help move furniture, paint walls, clean and help us restore the room. Work will start the week of April 8 if you are interested in lending a hand.

The refresh funding is supported by the Auxiliary and Club funds on hand, but like any project the scope continues to creep. Funds for the refresh are being raised through the 300 Club, so please help if you can.

The Rolling Raffle generates \$12,000 annually which is directed toward smaller projects such as the playground move and the pavilion updates. Your continued support of the raffle will help the Board fund other Club improvements. Please visit www.pibyc.org to order your ticket today.

With Club membership at an all-time high, there are challenges that need to be addressed to successfully serve our members and guests. The Board and I have heard your suggestions and concerns and hope to implement the following improvements:

- When there are events at the Club—this includes the regattas—we will remain open to our members. We may have to limit food and beverage offerings, but our goal is to make sure the Club is available for your use. The weekly updates, emailed on Monday, will note disruptions to normal operations. Be sure you receive our weekly updates and that they aren't in your spam or promotions folder.
- Dick's Burgers will be back for the 2024 season. We will make a few adjustments including adding a hot dog option and are looking at other sides. The official start date is Thursday May 16, but the next week will be on a Wednesday so watch the *PIBYC Weekly* for any changes.
- We are reviewing the menu offerings and sales performance to create an updated menu available in May. Weekly specials will be offered and listed in the weekly updates.
- Lines. We know you don't like them. Bar selections and pricing will be printed and available to assist in your beverage choices. We will be activating and using both POS terminals behind the bar and are looking at other options to speed up service or increase the number of stations.

I am honored to serve as your Commodore and am looking forward to a very busy and successful season. Please reach out and let me know how I can make things better.

Elsewhere you'll find updates on events throughout the season. Power Fleet Captain Herb Albrecht has put together a great schedule which includes a weekend at Middle Bass in June. Let's make a plan for islanders to boat or Sonny-S over and join them for dinner on Saturday June 22!

As we begin a new season, let's take a quick look back on our financial performance last year. We accomplished a lot at the club, but we didn't make much money doing so. Our Net Income was \$17,259 compared to \$147,425 in 2022.

- Total Revenues were about \$610,000, down \$13,000 from 2022. Restaurant and Bar Sales were \$296,000—48% of the total. Dues were \$193,000—31%, while Ship's Store sales, Dockage, Fundraising and Other categories made up the rest.
- Bar Sales increased by \$5,202 while the cost of sales rose \$15,274. Food Sales declined by \$8,837 yet costs rose by \$16,482. We obviously did not adjust prices to keep up with inflation.
- In total, Other Expenses grew by \$85,000. The largest increases were as follows:
 - Wages: rose substantially as we added staff \$42,000
 - **Insurance:** due to increased coverage and \$8,700 higher sales
 - Maintenance: building repair and other \$7,200
 - Depreciation: fixed asset acquisitions in \$8,000 recent years
 - Property Taxes: county revaluation \$8,000

To summarize, Revenue is down is by \$13,000; Cost of Goods Sold is up by \$32,000 and Other Expenses are up by \$85,000 which results in a reduction of Net Income of \$130,000.

While the drop in net income is concerning, be assured the Flag Officers and Board are focused on managing our finances; increasing revenues and controlling expenses. Keep in mind that the club has enjoyed significant growth over the last several years and growing pains are to be expected.

I anticipate that our Net Income from Operations will be more like 2023 rather than 2022 as we go forward. So we need your support to help fund improvements to the club that are planned or in the works. The Fundraising Committee has a new initiative, The 300 Club, designed to fund the improvements to the front room of the club. See page 7 for more information on this worthy fundraiser.

We have recently filed our federal Form 990 with the IRS. Please contact me if you would like to receive a copy of that return or other financial reports and information.

From the Editor



Did you know that it was 100 years ago that our clubhouse and pavilion were completed? In 1924 our clubhouse was an unheated¹ single room with a wraparound porch. It has grown as the PIBYC

family has grown. The galley and bathrooms were added in 1953, the back room was added in 1964 and expanded in 1976. The final rear addition was 1998. Our outside spaces expanded

as well. We bought, (sold and bought again) the property that is now our parking lot in 1968 and 1972², built the front barn in 1989 and the swim/sail barn in 2006. Our front patio, little more than a sidewalk, morphed into an inviting space with umbrella tables in 2005 and, through incredibly lucky timing, again in 2020, just in time to fulfill our social distancing needs.

No doubt the people who built the original clubhouse would be amazed at all the changes. The club will be closed during



April to complete yet another change: the redecoration of the front room. It will look different and yet will be the same space we all love... only better. Be sure to thank Sue Fegen and her crew for their hard work!
